BY-LAW NO. X

BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE PARKING IN THE TOWN OF ESPANOLA

WHEREAS the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Espanola deems it desirable to enact a by-law to amend all the other by-laws to regulate traffic and parking in the Corporation of the Town of Espanola.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Espanola enacts as follows:

PART I - DEFINITIONS:

1. IN THIS BY-LAW:

- (1) "AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE" includes vehicles of the Fire Department, Police vehicles, ambulances and any other emergency vehicles of Federal, Provincial or Municipal Departments or of public or private utilities;
- (2) "AUTHORIZED SIGN" means any sign or other device placed or erected on a highway under the authority of this by-law for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic and includes official signs;
- (3) "BOULEVARD" means that part of the highway situated between the roadway and the property lines of the lots abutting the highway and excludes a shoulder and a sidewalk, if any;
- (4) "BUS STOP" means that portion of a highway designated by authorized sign to or for the use of buses as space for loading and unloading passengers only;
- (5) "COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE" means a motor vehicle having permanently attached thereto a truck or delivery body and includes ambulances, hearses, fire apparatus, buses and tractors used for hauling purposes on the highways;
- (6) "DETACHMENT COMMANDER" means the Detachment Commander of the Local OPP Detachment;
- (7) "CORPORATION" means the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (8) "COUNCIL" means the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (9) "CROSSWALKS" means,
 - (a) that part of a highway at an intersection that is included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway, or
 - (b) any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or other markings on the surface;
- (10) "DRIVER" means every person who drives a vehicle on a highway or is in actual physical control of a vehicle;
- (11) "GROSS WEIGHT" means the combines weight of a vehicle and load;
- (12) "ACCESSIBLE PERMIT" means a permit issued by the Ministry of Transportation pursuant to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act of Ontario, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter and amendments thereto.

- (13) “HEAVY VEHICLE” means a commercial vehicle having a weight, when unloaded, of three (3) tons or more or, when loaded, of five (5) tons or more, but does not include a passenger vehicle, an ambulance or any vehicle of a police or fire department.
- (14) “HIGHWAY” includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof;
- (15) “INTERSECTION” means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other;
- (16) “MOTOR VEHICLE” includes an automobile, motorcycle, motor assisted bicycle and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, but does not include the cars of electric or steam railways, or other motor vehicles running only upon rails, or a motorized snow vehicle, traction engine, farm tractor, self-propelled implement of husbandry or road-building machine;
- (17) “MUNICIPALITY” means the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (18) “OFFICIAL SIGN” means a sign consistent with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices;
- (19) “ONE-WAY STREET” means a highway upon which vehicular traffic is limited to movement in one direction;
- (20) “PARK” OR “PARKING” when prohibited, means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers;
- (21) “PEDESTRIAN” means any person afoot or in a wheelchair or a child in a carriage;
- (22) “PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER” means a portion of a roadway, designated by by-law of the Municipality, at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing signs on the highway and lines or other markings on the surface of the roadway as prescribed by the regulations under THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H8 as amended;
- (23) “PERSON” includes every natural person, firm, partnership, association or corporation;
- (24) “PERSON IN CHARGE OF MARRIAGE CEREMONY” means any person permitted to solemnize a marriage ceremony under The Marriage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.3 as amended;
- (25) “POLICE OFFICER” is a member of the Ontario Provincial Police;
- (26) “THE PROVINCIAL OFFENCES ACT” means The Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P33 as amended and regulations thereto;
- (27) “ROADWAY” means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, but does not include the shoulder, and, where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term “roadway” refers to any one roadway separately and not to all the roadways collectively;
- (28) “SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONE” means that part of a highway designated for the use of school buses for loading and unloading of school children;
- (29) “SIDEWALK” means a part or strip of land paved or otherwise, in, on or alongside a highway and designed and intended for or used by, the general public for pedestrian travel. “Sidewalk” includes any structure above or below ground designed or intended for the use of pedestrians even if said structure is wholly or partially above or below a highway.
- (30) “SIGNAL-LIGHT TRAFFIC CONTROL SYSTEM” means a Signal Light Traffic Control System as described in Subsection 19 of Section 124, of The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1980, chapter 198 as amended from time to time;

- (31) "STOP" OR "STOPPING" when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal;
- (32) "THROUGH HIGHWAY" means any highway or part of highway designated as such by the Minister of Transportation and Communications or by, By-law of the Municipality, and every such highway shall be marked by a stop sign or yield right-of-way sign in compliance with the regulations of the Ontario Ministry of Transportation and Communications;
- (33) "TRAFFIC" includes pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, buses and other conveyances, either singly or together while using any highway for the purpose of travel;
- (34) "TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE" means any sign, signal-light traffic control system, traffic signal, marking or device, placed or erected by the authority of Council for the purposes of regulating, warning or guiding traffic;
- (35) "U-TURN" means to turn a vehicle within a roadway to proceed in the opposite direction to the direction in which the said vehicle was proceeding immediately prior to the said turn;
- (36) "VEHICLE" includes a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, farm tractor, road-building machine and any motor vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power, but does not include a motorized snow vehicle or the cars of electric or steam railways running only upon rails;
- (37) "YELLOW ZONE" means parking prohibited as referred to in Section 5 of this by-law.
- (38) "COMMUNITY SAFETY ZONE" parts of a roadway where public safety is of special concern including roadways near schools, day care centres, retirement facilities, or areas of roadway with high accident rates.
- (39) "JAKE BRAKES" is a secondary breaking system on a transport truck operated through the engine or the transmission to slow the transport down.

PART II - AUTHORIZED SIGNS AND TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

2. THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

- (1) The Superintendent of Public Works of the Corporation is hereby authorized to place or erect, and to maintain such authorized signs and traffic control devices, as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this by-law or as are required to warn or guide traffic for the safety or convenience of the public;
- (2) Unless otherwise permitted herein, no person shall place, maintain or display upon or in view of any highway any sign, signal, marking or device which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles from view or interferes with the effectiveness of any authorized sign or traffic control device, or which conceals from view or interferes with the effectiveness of an authorized sign or traffic control device.
- (3) Yellow paint applied to a curb is hereby declared to be an authorized sign indicating that parking is prohibited where the curb is so marked;

PART III - PEDESTRIAN RIGHTS AND DUTIES

3. (1) Except where the traffic control signals are in operation or where traffic is being controlled by a Police Officer, a pedestrian crossing a highway at a place other than a pedestrian crossover, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles and upon the roadway, but nothing in the Section shall relieve the driver of a vehicle from the obligation from taking all due care to avoid an accident.
- (2) No pedestrian shall proceed over or go under a barrier permanently installed at a safety zone or on a sidewalk.
- (3) No person shall play or take part in any game or sport upon a roadway, no person upon roller skates or riding in or by means of any coaster, toy vehicle or similar device shall go upon a roadway.

PART IV - PARKING AND STOPPING

4. METHOD OF PARKING

- (1) No person shall cause a vehicle to be stopped on any highway unless on the right side of the highway, having regard to the direction in which the vehicle has been proceeding;
 - (a) with the right front and right rear wheels or runner not more than fifteen centimeters (15cm) from the curb or edge on the roadway, but this provision shall not apply to prevent the parking of a vehicle on the left side of a one-way street, nor prevent the angle parking of a vehicle on highways or parts of highways or parts is permitted; or,
 - (b) where there is no curb or rolled curb, with the right front and rear wheels parallel to and as near to the right hand limit of the highway as is practical without stopping or parking on a sidewalk, footpath or on any part of the highway where grass is grown or which is not intended for the use of vehicles;
- (2) Where parking is permitted on a one-way street, a person may park a vehicle facing only in the direction in which it was proceeding and parallel to and distant not more than fifteen (15cm) centimeters from the curb edge of the roadway.

5. PARKING PROHIBITED:

- (1) No person shall at any time park a vehicle in any of the following places:
 - (a) on or overhanging a sidewalk;
 - (b) on a boulevard, except on a boulevard on the east side of Highway 6/Centre between Albert Street and Syroid Street
 - (c) within an intersection;
 - (d) on a crosswalk;
 - (e) within three (3) meters of a fire hydrant, laterally measured along the roadway immediately adjacent to the hydrant;
 - (f) within six (6) meters of a crosswalk or stop signs at an intersection;
 - (g) in front of, or within one and one half (1.5) meters of the entrance to private driveway or so as to prevent ingress or egress to or from such driveway;
 - (h) in front of or within three (3) meters of an entrance to or exit from a public lane or driveway;
 - (i) within a school bus loading zone, unless that vehicle is a bus as defined in The Highway Traffic Act;
 - (j) unless otherwise specified, on any bridge, or the approach thereto;
 - (k) in such a position as to prevent the convenient removal of any vehicle previously parked;
 - (l) where merchandise is regularly delivered or removed, or opposite the entrance to any hospital or in front of an entrance to or any emergency exit from any theatre, auditorium or other building, or for a reasonable time immediately preceding and following such assemblages;
 - (m) upon any street in such manner or under such conditions as to have available less than three (3) meters of the roadway for free movement of vehicular traffic, except that a driver may stop temporarily during the actual loading or unloading of passengers except where stopping is prohibited, or when necessary in obedience to traffic regulations or traffic signs or signals of a Police Officer;
 - (n) on any street in such a manner as to obstruct traffic;
 - (o) on any street in such a manner as to interfere with municipal services;
 - (p) no person who sells, offers for sale, takes orders for goods, wares, merchandise, or product from a vehicle shall, for the purpose of carrying on his business, stop the vehicle on any part of the highway line between two (2) intersecting highways for more than thirty (30) minutes of any day or for more than ten (10) minutes within the said thirty (30) minute period at any one location;
 - (q) on any parts of the Highways named and described in Schedule "A" to this bylaw.

- (2) In specified places where authorized signs to that effect are displayed, no person shall at any time park any vehicle:
 - (a) on any highway within six (6) meters of any intersection on any through street;
 - (b) on any highway adjacent or opposite to any school property, municipal playground, municipal park, municipal ball field or municipal recreation area;
 - (c) on any of the parts of the highways named and described in Schedule "A" to this By-law;
 - (d) on, in, or upon any public lane;
 - (e) on any highway within six (6) meters of any point designated as a bus stop or as a bus terminal, measured in the direction of travel of buses on that side of the highway or within eighteen (18) meters of such point measured in the opposite direction except for buses;
 - (f) within seven and five tenths (7.5) meters of any fire hall on the side of the highway on which the fire hall is located or within thirty and five tenths (30.5) meters of such fire hall on the opposite side of the highway;
 - (g) on any highway within fifteen (15) meters of the termination of a dead-end street;
- (3) In specified places where authorized signs are displayed;
 - (a) no person shall park a vehicle on any of the parts of the highways named and described in Schedule "B" to this by-law during the hours set out in the Schedule.
- (4) Exceptions: The provisions of this section shall not apply to:
 - (a) a postal vehicle while actually engaged in loading mail from the postal box;
 - (b) a vehicle engaged solely for the transportation of money for commercial establishments while engaged in delivering or picking up money or valuables;
 - (c) Espanola Care Van
- (5) When properly worded signs have been erected and are on display, no person shall park a vehicle between the hours of eight (8:00) a.m. to five (5:00) p.m. from Monday to Friday on any of the streets, parts of streets or sides of streets named or described in schedule "G" to this by-law.

6. PARKING RESTRICTED:

- (1) When authorized signs are displayed;
 - (a) no person shall park a vehicle for a period longer than two (2) hours, between the hours of nine (9) a.m. to six (6) p.m. on weekdays, except Fridays when the hours shall be from nine (9) a.m. to nine (9) p.m. on any of the streets, parts of the streets or sides of streets named or described in Schedule "B" to this by-law; or,
 - (b) no person shall stop or park a vehicle other than a bus in any bus stop, named or described in Schedule "C" to this By-law; or
 - (c) no person shall stop or park a vehicle in an area named or described in Schedule "F" to this by-law, except if such vehicle contains a "Accessible Permit" issued pursuant to Section 1, Sub-section 11 herein, in which instance the vehicle will be permitted to park for a time not to exceed two (2) hours.
 - (d) no person shall stop or park a vehicle in an area named or described in Schedule "F" to this by-law without visibly displaying a "Accessible Permit".
- (2) During night hours in winter months, no person shall park a vehicle on any highway under the jurisdiction of the municipality, between the hours of two (2) o'clock in the morning and seven (7) o'clock in the morning, during the period from the first day of November in one year until the last day of March in the next year, except physicians on emergency calls and operators of authorized vehicles.

7. ANGLE PARKING:

- (1) Angle parking in accordance with the provisions in Section 3 hereof is permitted in the parts of the highways named and described in Schedule "E" of this by-law.

8. LOADING AND UNLOADING OF COMMERCIAL VEHICLES:

- (1) No person shall park a commercial motor vehicle on any street for the purpose of loading or unloading occupants and/or merchandise for a longer period than is actually necessary for such loading or unloading and providing that where there is a lane in the rear or at the side of business premises, the loading and unloading of merchandise from commercial vehicles must be from the lane, not off the street in front of the premises.

9. PARKING PROHIBITED FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES:

- (1) No person shall stop or park a vehicle upon any highway for the purpose of:
 - (a) displaying for sale;
 - (b) storing it;
 - (c) washing, servicing, painting or repairing it, except where such repairing is necessary for the removal of the vehicle from the highway, or where such repairs have been necessitated by an emergency;
 - (d) advertising, unless specifically authorized by the Council of the Town of Espanola.
 - (e) along the tracks of any railroad other than a street railway;
 - (f) in such a position as will prevent the removal of any other vehicle previously parked;
 - (g) on a highway at a place marked by an authorized sign as a passenger or freight loading zone during the time shown on such sign;
 - (h) signs referred to in subsection (g) shall not be displayed except with the approval of the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Espanola.

10. LOADING ZONES

- (1) Commercial vehicles: where authorized signs to that effect are displayed, no person shall park a vehicle between the hours of nine (9) a.m. and six (6) p.m. of any day except Sundays and holidays on any of the parts of the highways named and described in Schedule "A" to this by-law except for the loading of merchandise by commercial motor vehicles provided that such loading and unloading shall not exceed thirty (30) minutes
- (2) School bus: The highway or portion of highways set out in Schedule "C" of this bylaw at the school or institution set out in Schedule "C" are hereby designated as School Bus Loading Zones as provided in The Highway Traffic Act as amended.

11. PARKING OF BICYCLES

- (1) No person shall park a bicycle along the curb of any street or on any boulevard or sidewalk unless the same stands securely upright.

12. MARRIAGE CEREMONIES AND FUNERALS

- (1) During a period commencing 60 minutes in advance of the scheduled time of any funeral service or marriage ceremony and ending immediately following the completion of the said funeral service or marriage ceremony, the operators of the funeral parlor or the person in charge of the marriage ceremony are hereby authorized to place "No Parking" signs on portable bases or along a maximum length of thirty eight (38m) meters of curb space in other areas to indicate that a funeral service or marriage ceremony is being held at a location adjacent to the parking area concerned and that parking is temporarily prohibited.
- (2) Where "No Parking" signs of the type mentioned in subsection (1) are displayed, no person shall park a vehicle at any of the parking meters concerned or along the curb space concerned, as the case may be, unless permitted to do so by the operator of the funeral home or the person in charge of the marriage ceremony who has placed the signs.
- (3) The said "No Parking" signs shall be removed by the person in charge of the marriage ceremony or the operator of the funeral home who has placed the said signs immediately following the completion of the marriage ceremony or funeral service.

13. EMERGENCY PROHIBITION OF PARKING

- (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the Detachment Commander during any emergency or special circumstances deemed sufficient therefore, may by the use of appropriate signs or signals, suspend the movement of any or all vehicular traffic on any street or portion thereof and/or, may suspend any or all parking thereon by authorizing the displaying of "No Parking" signs. The Detachment Commander or his Designate during such emergency, may declare that any vehicle already parked is being parked illegally regardless of the time permitted for parking such vehicle under provisions of this by-law and notwithstanding that the period allowed to the owner or driver under this by-law has not expired, provided, however, that in this event, the owner or driver of such vehicle is personally notified by a police officer that parking at such place has been suspended, and further, that the owner or driver of such vehicles is allowed a reasonable period of time to remove the said vehicle.
- (2) Exceptions: Sections 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 shall not, if compliance therewith would be impracticable, apply to authorized emergency vehicles while actually engaged in responding to an emergency.

PART VI - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**31. REMOVAL OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES:**

- (1) When any vehicle is parked in contravention of any section of this by-law, a Police Officer may take such vehicle or cause same to be taken to and stored in a suitable place and all costs and charges for removal, care or storage thereof, shall be a lien upon such vehicle.

PART VII - PENALTIES

40. PARKING VIOLATIONS GENERALLY:

- (1) Any person violating the provisions of Part IV of this by-law shall be subject to a penalty of not less than **\$15.00 and not more than \$200.00** exclusive of costs, and such penalty shall be recoverable under The Provincial Offences Act.

41. OTHER VIOLATIONS:

- (1) Any person violating the provisions of this by-law shall be subject to a **maximum penalty of \$5,000.00** exclusive of costs, and such penalty shall be recoverable under The Provincial Offences Act.

42. VOLUNTARY PAYMENT OF PENALTIES:

- (1) When a vehicle is found parked or stopped in contravention of the parking or stopping provisions of this By-law, the police officer, the Corporation's Municipal Law Enforcement Officer so finding the vehicle may issue a summons or attach to the vehicle a parking ticket in the form of a serially-numbered notice, stating:
 - (a) the license number or permit of the vehicle;
 - (b) the date, time, place and nature of the alleged offense;
 - (c) the procedure for making a voluntary payment of the penalty, which voluntary payment shall not be less than the prescribed amount set out in Section 39 of this By-law, Part VII;
 - (d) that in the event of the failure to make such payment within the prescribed time period, the provisions of the Provincial Offences Act shall be applicable.
- (2) The owner or operator of the vehicle may, within five days, exclusive of Sundays and Holidays, after the day of alleged offense, report to or mail to the Clerk, The Corporation of the Town of Espanola, 100 Tudhope Street, Suite 2, Espanola, Ontario, P5E 1S6 or to such other institutions as the Clerk may in writing authorize, and to pay to these persons authorized to receive such payment, the amount shown on the ticket, which shall be accepted as payment of the penalty in full satisfaction in respect of the alleged offense, and a receipt therefore shall be given to the person making the payment.
- (3) The Clerk of The Corporation of the Town of Espanola shall receive all monies collected under this section, and may pay or authorize the deduction of a service fee to institutions for tickets collected by those institutions.
- (4) If a voluntary payment is not made in accordance with the procedure provided in subsection (2) of this section, the procedure of, The Provincial Offences Act shall apply.

43. PENALTIES:

- (1) The owner of a vehicle that is in contravention of this or amending By-laws is guilty of an offense and on conviction is liable to a **maximum fine of \$5,000.00** dollars exclusive of costs unless the owner proves to the satisfaction of the court that at the time of the offense the motor vehicle was in the possession of another person without the owner's consent, express or implied.

44. ONTARIO HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT TO GOVERN:

- (1) The provisions of this by-law shall be subject to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act as amended and to any regulations made thereunder and any reference in this by-law to the said Highway Traffic Act or any provisions thereof shall be deemed to be a reference to the said Highway Traffic Act or provisions thereof as amended or re-enacted from time to time and to all Regulations made under the said Act.

45. AUTHORIZED SIGNS:

- (1) For the purpose of this by-law, the signs contained in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices are the authorized signs.
- (2) Signs as per subsection 1 may be altered from time to time to satisfy municipal needs.

46. SCHEDULES:

- (1) Schedules “A” to “Q” inclusive, which are attached hereto, are hereby, made a part of this By-law and shall be construed herewith.

47. TIMES:

- (1) Whenever certain hours are named herein, they shall mean Standard Time or Daylight Saving Time, whichever shall be in official current use in the Municipality.

48. REPEAL:

- (1) By-law 1410/99 of The Corporation of the Town of Espanola and any and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed on the approval of the short form wording and the effective date of this by-law. In addition, any or all by-laws in conflict or at variance herewith are hereby repealed and this by-law shall take precedence.

49. JURISDICTION:

- (1) The provisions of this by-law shall only apply to those highways in the Municipality, which are under the jurisdiction of the Municipality.

50. MUNICIPAL APPROVAL AND EFFECTIVE DATE:

- (1) This by-law shall not come into force until approved by the Council of The Corporation of The Town of Espanola, nor shall any particular provision become effective until the sign or signs, if any, applicable to such particular provisions have been erected and are on display and short form wording has been approved by the Ontario Court of Justice.
- (2) Subject to subsection (1) above, this by-law shall come into force and take effect once given a third reading by Council.
