

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF ESPANOLA

BYLAW NO. 3204/24

BEING A BYLAW TO REGULATE TRAFFIC IN THE TOWN OF ESPANOLA AND TO REPEAL AND REPLACE BYLAW NO. 2030/07 AND AMENDMENTS THERETO

WHEREAS the Municipal Corporation of the Town of Espanola deems it desirable to enact a bylaw to amend all the other bylaws to regulate traffic and parking in the Corporation of the Town of Espanola.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Town of Espanola enacts as follows:

PART I - DEFINITIONS:

1. IN THIS BYLAW:

- (1) "ACCESSIBLE PERMIT" means a permit issued by the Ministry of Transportation pursuant to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act of Ontario, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter and amendments thereto.
- (2) "AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLE" includes vehicles of the Fire Department, Police vehicles, ambulances and any other emergency vehicles of Federal, Provincial or Municipal Departments or of public or private utilities;
- (3) "AUTHORIZED SIGN" means any sign or other device placed or erected on a highway under the authority of this bylaw for the purpose of regulating, warning or guiding traffic and includes official signs;
- (4) "BOULEVARD" means that part of the highway situated between the roadway and the property lines of the lots abutting the highway and excludes a shoulder and a sidewalk, if any;
- (5) "BUS STOP" means that portion of a highway designated by authorized sign to or for the use of buses as space for loading and unloading passengers only;
- (6) "COMMERCIAL MOTOR VEHICLE" means a motor vehicle having permanently attached thereto a truck or delivery body and includes ambulances, hearses, fire apparatus, buses and tractors used for hauling purposes on the highways;
- (7) "CORPORATION" means the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (8) "COUNCIL" means the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (9) "CROSSWALKS" means,
 - (a) that part of a highway at an intersection that is included within the connections of the lateral lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from the curbs or, in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the roadway, or
 - (b) any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by signs or by lines or other markings on the surface;
- (10) "DETACHMENT COMMANDER" means the Detachment Commander of the Local OPP Detachment;
- (11) "DRIVER" means every person who drives a vehicle on a highway or is in actual physical control of a vehicle;
- (12) "EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONDER" means any person employed by or assigned responsibilities to act on behalf of a police, fire or paramedical service in the active performance of their duties.

- (13) "GROSS WEIGHT" means the combines weight of a vehicle and load;
- (14) "HEAVY VEHICLE" means a commercial vehicle having a weight, when unloaded, of three (3) tons or more or, when loaded, of five (5) tons or more, but does not include a passenger vehicle, an ambulance or any vehicle of a police or fire department.
- (15) "HIGHWAY" includes a common and public highway, street, sidewalk, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof;
- (16) "INTERSECTION" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of the lateral curb lines or, if none, then of the lateral boundary lines of two or more highways that join one another at an angle, whether or not one highway crosses the other;
- (17) "MOTOR VEHICLE" includes an automobile, motorcycle, motor assisted bicycle and any other vehicle propelled or driven otherwise than by muscular power, but does not include the cars of electric or steam railways, or other motor vehicles running only upon rails, or a motorized snow vehicle, traction engine, farm tractor, self-propelled implement of husbandry or road-building machine;
- (18) "MUNICIPAL BYLAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER" is a person employed by the Municipality to enforce municipal bylaws.
- (19) "MUNICIPALITY" means the Corporation of the Town of Espanola;
- (20) "OFFICIAL SIGN" means a sign consistent with the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices;
- (21) "ONE-WAY STREET" means a highway upon which vehicular traffic is limited to movement in one direction;
- (22) "PARK" OR "PARKING" when prohibited, means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when standing temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading merchandise or passengers;
- (23) "PEDESTRIAN" means any person afoot or in a wheelchair or a child in a carriage;
- (24) "PEDESTRIAN CROSSOVER" means a portion of a roadway, designated by bylaw of the Municipality, at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing signs on the highway and lines or other markings on the surface of the roadway as prescribed by the regulations under THE HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter H8 as amended;
- (25) "PERSON" includes every natural person, firm, partnership, association or corporation;
- (26) "PERSON IN CHARGE OF MARRIAGE CEREMONY" means any person permitted to solemnize a marriage ceremony under The Marriage Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.3 as amended;
- (27) "POLICE OFFICER" is a member of the Ontario Provincial Police;
- (28) "THE PROVINCIAL OFFENCES ACT" means The Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter P33 as amended and regulations thereto;
- (29) "ROADWAY" means the part of the highway that is improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular traffic, but does not include the shoulder, and, where a highway includes two or more separate roadways, the term "roadway" refers to any one roadway separately and not to all the roadways collectively;
- (30) "SCHOOL BUS LOADING ZONE" means that part of a highway designated for the use of school buses for loading and unloading of school children;
- (31) "SIDEWALK" means a part or strip of land paved or otherwise, in, on or alongside a highway and designed and intended for or used by, the general public for pedestrian travel. "Sidewalk" includes any structure above or below ground designed or intended for the use of pedestrians even if said structure is wholly or partially above or below a highway.

- (32) "SIGNAL-LIGHT TRAFFIC CONTROL SYSTEM" means a Signal Light Traffic Control System as described in Subsection 19 of Section 124, of The Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1980, chapter 198 as amended from time to time;
- (33) "STOP" OR "STOPPING" when prohibited, means the halting of a vehicle, even momentarily, whether occupied or not, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or of a traffic control sign or signal;
- (34) "THROUGH HIGHWAY" means any highway or part of highway designated as such by the Minister of Transportation and Communications or by, Bylaw of the Municipality, and every such highway shall be marked by a stop sign or yield right-of-way sign in compliance with the regulations of the Ontario Ministry of Transportation and Communications;
- (35) "TRAFFIC" includes pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, buses and other conveyances, either singly or together while using any highway for the purpose of travel;
- (36) "TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICE" means any sign, signal-light traffic control system, traffic signal, marking or device, placed or erected by the authority of Council for the purposes of regulating, warning or guiding traffic;
- (37) "U-TURN" means to turn a vehicle within a roadway to proceed in the opposite direction to the direction in which the said vehicle was proceeding immediately prior to the said turn;
- (38) "VEHICLE" includes a motor vehicle, trailer, traction engine, farm tractor, road-building machine and any motor vehicle drawn, propelled or driven by any kind of power, including muscular power, but does not include a motorized snow vehicle or the cars of electric or steam railways running only upon rails. Despite this definition, snow a motorized snow vehicle is defined as a "vehicle" for the purposes of parking related provisions;
- (39) "YELLOW ZONE" means parking prohibited as referred to in Section 5 of this bylaw.
- (40) "COMMUNITY SAFETY ZONE" parts of a roadway where public safety is of special concern including roadways near schools, day care centres, retirement facilities, or areas of roadway with high accident rates.
- (41) "JAKE BRAKES" is a secondary breaking system on a transport truck operated through the engine or the transmission to slow the transport down.

PART II - AUTHORIZED SIGNS AND TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES

2. THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC WORKS:

- (1) The Superintendent of Public Works of the Corporation is hereby authorized to place or erect, and to maintain such authorized signs and traffic control devices, as may be necessary to give effect to the provisions of this bylaw or as are required to warn or guide traffic for the safety or convenience of the public;
- (2) Unless otherwise permitted herein, no person shall place, maintain or display upon or in view of any highway any sign, signal, marking or device which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles from view or interferes with the effectiveness of any authorized sign or traffic control device, or which conceals from view or interferes with the effectiveness of an authorized sign or traffic control device.
- (3) Yellow paint applied to a curb is hereby declared to be an authorized sign indicating that parking is prohibited where the curb is so marked;

PART III - PEDESTRIAN RIGHTS AND DUTIES

3. (1) Except where the traffic control signals are in operation or where traffic is being controlled by a Police Officer, a pedestrian crossing a highway at a place other than a pedestrian crossover, shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles and upon the roadway, but nothing in the Section shall relieve the driver of a vehicle from the obligation from taking all due care to avoid an accident.

- (2) No pedestrian shall proceed over or go under a barrier permanently installed at a safety zone or on a sidewalk.
- (3) No person shall play or take part in any game or sport upon a roadway, no person upon roller skates or riding in or by means of any coaster, toy vehicle or similar device shall go upon a roadway.

PART IV - OPERATION OF VEHICLES

4. BARRICADES:

- (1) No vehicle shall be driven through or entered upon any highway roped or barricaded or marked by an authorized sign prohibiting its use for the time being owing to repairs or for any other reason.

5. EMERGING FROM LANE OR DRIVEWAY:

- (1) The driver of a vehicle emerging from a driveway, lane, lot or building shall yield the right-of-way to all pedestrians prior to driving onto the sidewalk and shall not enter the roadway until he can do so in safety.

6. VEHICLES ON SIDEWALK:

- (1) No person shall drive a vehicle on a sidewalk except for the purpose of directly crossing sidewalk on a permanent or temporary driveway.
- (2) No person shall drive a motor vehicle over a raised curb except at a place where there is a ramp.

7. BACKING:

- (1) No driver of a vehicle shall back into an intersection or over a crosswalk.
- (2) No driver of a vehicle shall, in any event or at any place, back a vehicle unless such movement can be made in safety.

8. COASTING:

- (1) Coasting, whether on sleighs, carts or express wagons, and tobogganing, is prohibited on all highways, sidewalks and bicycle paths.

9. FUNERAL AND OTHER PROCESSIONS

- (1) No person shall intersect a funeral or other properly authorized procession while it is in motion, except under the direction of a police officer.
- (2) The driver of a vehicle in a funeral or other authorized procession shall drive as near to the right hand edge of the roadway as practicable and follow the vehicle ahead as close as is practicable and safe.

10. BOARDING AND ALIGHTING FROM VEHICLES:

- (1) No person shall board or alight from any vehicle while such vehicle is in motion.

11. DRIVE OVER FIRE HOSES:

- (1) No person shall drive over a fire hose unless directed to do so by a police officer/fire fighter.

12. EXCESS LOADS:

- (1) No person shall move or cause to be moved on any highway within the Municipality any heavy vehicles, loads, object, or structure in excess of the limits prescribed in The Highway Traffic Act as amended.
- (2) The Manager of Public Works is hereby appointed and authorized to issue on behalf of the Corporation permits as prescribed in The Highway Traffic Act as amended with full power and authority to grant or refuse any such permit and to attach such terms and conditions to the permits as may be attached by virtue of The Highway Traffic Act.
- (3) The provisions of Sections 122 of The Highway Traffic Act as amended are hereby declared to be in force where signs are posted during the Spring breakup inclusive in each and every year in respect of all Highways within the Municipality.
- (4) Subsection 3 shall not apply to a Highway or part of a Highway that is an extension of the route of a King's Highway through or in a Regional Area except at such times as Sections 104 (a) and 104 (b) of The Highway Traffic Act as amended apply to the King's Highway of which any such Highway is an extension.

13. LINES PAINTED ON ROADWAY:

- (1) No person shall drive or attempt to drive on or over, or tamper with or walk on any newly painted lines or series of lines, or any newly painted signs on any roadway or crosswalk, when the presence of such is indicated by markers or lighted lanterns.

14. TURNING MOVEMENTS:

- (1) Where a U-turn is not otherwise prohibited under this Bylaw, such a turn shall be made only where it can be made in safety and without interfering with other traffic.
- (2) Where official signs to that effect are displayed, no person operating a vehicle shall make a U-turn at any location or intersection named and described in Schedule "A" to this bylaw.
- (3) Where authorized signs and/or road markings to that effect are displayed, every person operating a vehicle shall make a left turn at any intersection named and described in Schedule "B" to this bylaw.

15. ONE-WAY STREETS:

- (1) The highways set out in Schedule "H" to this bylaw between the limits set out in the said schedule are hereby designated for one-way traffic only in the direction set out in the Schedule.

16. THROUGH HIGHWAYS:

- (1) The parts of the highways named and described in Schedule "C" to this Bylaw are designated as "Through Highways" as defined in The Highway Traffic Act as amended.
- (2) The designation in Subsection 1 of a highway as a "Through Highway" shall not include any intersection thereon.

17. STOPS AT INTERSECTIONS:

- (1) The intersection of highways set out in Schedule "D" to this bylaw are designated as intersections where stop signs shall be erected facing oncoming traffic traveling in the direction of travel and on the highways shown in the said schedule.

18. YIELD RIGHT-OF-WAY:

- (1) The intersection of highways set out in Schedule “E” to this bylaw are designated as intersections where yield signs shall be erected facing oncoming traffic traveling in the direction of travel and on the highways shown in the said schedule.

19. TRUCK ROUTES:

- (1) The parts of highways named and described in Schedule “F” to this bylaw are hereby designated as “Truck Routes”.
- (2) No heavy vehicle shall be operated on any highway within the Municipality other than on the parts of the highways set out in Schedule “F” hereof, provided however:
 - (a) that any commercial motor vehicle may be operated on any highway in the Municipality for the purpose of delivering or receiving, loading or unloading goods, wares, merchandise or materials or in proceeding to or from a garage or other premises for the housing or repair of such motor vehicles and provided that:
 - (i) such deviation shall be made at a point on one of the said truck routes nearest by the road to where the services are performed, and,
 - (ii) on completion of the conduct of business such vehicle shall return by the shortest route to the nearest truck route;
 - (b) No heavy vehicle shall be parked in any residential area for a longer period than two (2) hours, except when engaged in the loading or unloading of the vehicle.
- (3) The provisions of subsection two (2) of this Section shall not apply to vehicles owned by the Corporation of The Town of Espanola, or to emergency vehicles of a public transit system.
- (4) Drivers are allowed to use the tractor only for traveling to and from their homes in residential areas.
- (5) The Corporation of The Town of Espanola through The Public Works Department may deem any other highway within the Town of Espanola as a truck route for an indefinite period of time by reason of construction or for any other emergency and any such highway shall be signed as such for the temporary period.

20. PRESCRIBED RATES OF SPEED:

- (1) No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a rate of speed greater than 50 kilometres per hour on any of the highways named and described in Schedule “C” to this bylaw, unless otherwise posted.
- (2) Where authorized signs are displayed, the maximum rate of speed on the highways named and described in Schedule “G” to this bylaw shall be the rate of speed prescribed in column 5 of the said Schedule “G”.
- (3) Where authorized signs are displayed, the highways named and described in Schedule “T” to this bylaw shall be designated as community safety zones under subsection 214.1 (1) or (2) of the Highway Traffic Act as amended.

PART V - MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

21. OBSTRUCTING TRAFFIC:

- (1) No person shall operate any vehicle upon or along any street so as to obstruct traffic unreasonably, in a manner so as to prevent traffic from maintaining a reasonable rate of speed.
- (2) Any person operating a slow moving vehicle shall operate it as near the right hand edge of the roadway as circumstances and weather conditions permit.
- (3) No person shall open excavations, erect barricades, or boarding, store earth, construction materials, or park work equipment on any portion of any street or open lane without first obtaining the necessary permit.

- (4) No driver of a vehicle shall enter any intersection unless there is sufficient space on the other side of the intersection or crosswalk to accommodate said vehicle without obstructing passage of other vehicles or pedestrians, notwithstanding any traffic signal indication to proceed.
- (5) No person shall throw, push, plow, dump or otherwise deposit any snow or ice on any highway or part thereof, by any means whatsoever, regardless of whether the snow or ice has been removed from an adjoining property, a private entrance, or a sidewalk.

22. OBEDIENCE TO SIGNALS OF POLICE OFFICER, TRAFFIC SIGN OF SIGNAL:

- (1) Every person shall promptly obey all signals or directions given by Emergency First Responders, Municipal Bylaw Enforcement Officers or traffic Control device or signal.

23. OBSTRUCTING SIDEWALKS:

- (1) Pedestrians shall not obstruct sidewalks, street corners or doorways.

24. UNLAWFUL RIDING:

- (1) No person shall ride on any vehicle upon any portion thereof, not designated or intended for passengers. This provision shall not apply to any employee engaged in necessary discharge of his duties or to persons riding within truck bodies in the space intended for merchandise. Any infraction of this section shall be the responsibility of the driver of the vehicle.

25. RIGHT OF PASSAGE:

- (1) All vehicles are required to pull to the right of the traveled portion of any street or road when overtaken or approached by a fire truck, ambulance or police vehicle with their siren operating.

26. JAKE BRAKES

- (1) No person shall apply Jake Brakes within the Town of Espanola.

PART VI - OFFENCE AND PENALTIES

27. OFFENCE

- (1) Every person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. P. 33, as amended.
- (2) For the purposes of Subsection 40, each day on which a person contravenes any of the provisions of this By law shall be deemed to constitute a separate offence under this Bylaw.
- (3) The making of a false or intentionally misleading statement or representation in any agreement or request for permission provided for by this By law shall be deemed to be a violation of the provisions of this By law.

28. VIOLATIONS

- (1) Any person violating the provisions of this bylaw shall be subject to a **maximum penalty of \$5,000.00** exclusive of costs, and such penalty shall be recoverable under The Provincial Offences Act.

29. PENALTIES:

- (1) The owner of a vehicle that is in contravention of this or amending Bylaws is guilty of an offense and on conviction is liable to a **maximum fine of \$5,000.00** dollars exclusive of costs unless the owner proves to the satisfaction of the court that at the time of the offense the motor vehicle was in the possession of another person without the owner's consent, express or implied.

30. ONTARIO HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT TO GOVERN:

- (1) The provisions of this bylaw shall be subject to the provisions of the Highway Traffic Act as amended and to any regulations made thereunder and any reference in this bylaw to the said Highway Traffic Act or any provisions thereof shall be deemed to be a reference to the said Highway Traffic Act or provisions thereof as amended or re-enacted from time to time and to all Regulations made under the said Act.

31. AUTHORIZED SIGNS:

- (1) For the purpose of this bylaw, the signs contained in the Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices are the authorized signs.
- (2) Signs as per subsection 1 may be altered from time to time to satisfy municipal needs.

32. SCHEDULES:

- (1) Schedules "A" to "Q" inclusive, which are attached hereto, are hereby, made a part of this Bylaw and shall be construed herewith.

33. TIMES:

- (1) Whenever certain hours are named herein, they shall mean Standard Time or Daylight Saving Time, whichever shall be in official current use in the Municipality.

34. REPEAL:

- (1) Bylaw 1410/99 of The Corporation of the Town of Espanola and any and all amendments thereto are hereby repealed on the approval of the short form wording and the effective date of this bylaw. In addition, any or all bylaws in conflict or at variance herewith are hereby repealed and this bylaw shall take precedence.

35. JURISDICTION:

- (1) The provisions of this bylaw shall only apply to those highways in the Municipality, which are under the jurisdiction of the Municipality.

36. MUNICIPAL APPROVAL AND EFFECTIVE DATE:

- (1) This bylaw shall not come into force until approved by the Council of The Corporation of The Town of Espanola, nor shall any particular provision become effective until the sign or signs, if any, applicable to such particular provisions have been erected and are on display and short form wording has been approved by the Ontario Court of Justice.
- (2) Subject to subsection (1) above, this bylaw shall come into force and take effect once given a third reading by Council.

PART VII – POWERS

27. ENFORCEMENT

- (1) This By law may be enforced by any Municipal Bylaw Enforcement Officer, Police Officer or their designate upon direction by Council.
- (2) No person shall hinder or obstruct, or attempt to hinder or obstruct any person exercising a power of performing a duty under this Bylaw.

PART VIII – SEVERABILITY / CONFLICT

- 28. If any section, subsection, part or parts of this Bylaw is declared by any court of law to be illegal or ultra vires, such section, subsection, paragraph, part or parts shall be deemed to be severable and all parts hereof are declared to be separate and independent and enacted as such.
- 29. Nothing in this Bylaw relieves any Person from complying with any provision of any federal or provincial legislation or any other Bylaw of the Municipality.
- 30. Where a provision of this Bylaw conflicts with the provisions of another Bylaw in force in the Town, the provision that establishes the higher standard to protect the health, safety and welfare of Persons or the environmental well-being of the municipality shall prevail.
