Support the Federation of Ontario Public Libraries: Creation of an Ontario Digital Public Library

Resolution:

WHEREAS Ontario's public libraries are essential to equitable, reliable access to broadband internet and computers;

AND WHEREAS the Ontario government has already committed to recognizing the importance of public libraries to broadband connectivity, including the "Building a Digital Ontario" initiative whereby \$4.8 million in investments were provided for broadband upgrades to over 100 public libraries across the province;

AND WHEREAS people rely on local public libraries for access to digital resources, including for job and career skills training, language learning, tutoring, health information and virtual appointments, and accessibility services;

AND WHEREAS the Espanola Public Library provides critical access to digital resources for many residents;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Province of Ontario support the creation of an Ontario Digital Public Library, in line with the attached recommendation from the Ontario Federation of Public Libraries, (FOPL);

AND FURTHER THAT a copy of this motion be sent to the Hon. Doug Ford, Premier of Ontario; the Hon. Stan Cho, Minister of Tourism, Culture, and Gaming; Dina Stevens, Executive Director of FOPL, MPP Michael Mantha; and to the Association of Municipalities of Ontario.
